

Fanny's Journey/ Le Voyage de Fanny

One of the Irish Film Institute's (IFI) most-popular French language titles for schools is this award-winning tale of courage, determination and survival set in occupied France. Jewish thirteenvear-old Fanny finds herself in charge of a band of children forced to flee the children's home where they live. Filled with heart-stopping moments, the children dodge authorities and real terrors as they make for the Swiss border, under the leadership of the fearless, determined girl.

Night Forest / Nachtwald

This New German language film, is an engrossing and tense teen drama featuring great performances and beautiful natural landscapes. Driven by the belief that a legendary cave exists in the Usulenberg mountain, Paul's dad sets off on an expedition, only to never return. A year later, the boy is struggling to cope with his father's disappearance. Convinced that the man was right. Paul sets off on a search with his best friend Max to try to uncover what actually happened to his father. This big summer adventure is ultimately a tale of friendship, freedom and imagination.

Cleo

Berlin-set, fun and dazzling comedy that recalls French favourite. Amelie. Following a childhood tragedy, Cleo longs to be able to turn back time. With her new friend Paul and a mysterious map. Cleo sets off on a quest to find a magic clock that has been missing since the 1920s. Berlin is bursting with zanv characters and urban legends, where Cleo seeks her heart's desire. Using stopmotion techniques and magic realism, Germany's capital truly shines in this romantic adventure.

The pitch will take the form of the filmmaker giving a broad idea of the project in 60 seconds. Then there will be a few minutes to answer questions and finally you will receive feedback. Times will be allocated and those booking will need good internet away from any distractions. Although a mock pitch this will be treated as a real pitching session to give filmmakers an authentic experience.





Set on a fictional remote Scottish island. Limbo tells the story of a group of newly arrived immigrants awaiting the results of their asylum claims. It centres on Omar (Amir El-Masry), a young Syrian musician who, thousands of miles from home, finds himself trapped by guilt, regret, and the grief he carries for the loss of his former identity.

Separated from his family and burdened by a plaster cast on his arm. Omar wanders the starkly beautiful landscape searching for answers to a complex past and daunting future. But while he is stuck there, he isn't alone. In between brief long-distance conversations with his parents and passing interactions with local oddballs, Omar and his new flatmates attend outrageously misjudged 'cultural awareness' classes, binge Friends boxsets, and debate attending the local open mic night.

Followed by virtual Q&A after the screening.



More than 10 years ago a young Basque girl Irune Gurtubai came to Birr-off her own bat-for two summers in a row-to spend time learning what she could from local filmmakers. Something must have rubbed off because 2021 saw the release of her second feature film as producer. Although Limbo has already screened in Cannes and other prestigious festivals, we're delighted to welcome it to OFFline this year-5 years after we screened Irune's debut feature-Pikadero-the only Irish festival to do so.

Irune and her husband director Ben Sharrock continue to bring us strong stories from the edge.

Berta Zenefels (84) has never seen the sea. She has barely ever left her beloved farm, the "Zollhaus" in Bavaria. Day by day, the born-landlady stands in the kitchen, where she has fried thousands of Schnitzels for her guests.

A life shaped by hard work, a life that nobody wants to live anymore. During her lifetime, she has buried her firstborn son, her husband, her grandson and her youngest son. Every single one of them lived and died for the big dream of the

Zollhaus. But without a successor the heavily-indebted farm is threatened with bankruptcy.

Then, her granddaughter Monika appears out of nowhere and decides to save the family-owned farm. Her sister and the film's director Hannah Schweier isn't too happy with the idea

Director Statement

What tempted me to do a documentary about my own family? Above all, I wanted one thing: to finally be able to make a film again after more than ten years.

At the time, I knew that I would be able to sell the story, "Two women who are fighting for the survival of a family farm," quite well and it was exactly like that. With this naive motivation, I started to shoot my first documentary almost three years ago. I don't know if I would do it again, especially if I had known what was going to happen on this journey.


















Our 2021 OFFline Animation Residents Éabha Bortolozzo & Jack Kirwan





Éabha and Jack are two young, Irish, multi-award winning directors. Since meeting in 2014 in their degree course in IADT Animation, the two have co-directed two short films together.

Their first film, The Usual, was well received and selected to screen nationally and internationally at festivals in Asia, the US and in Europe.

Her Song is their second film and revolves around the Mother & Baby homes that were in operation in Ireland throughout the 20th Century. Since it's completion in March 2020, it has secured a longlist nomination for the Academy Awards 2022 and an IFTA for Best Animation as well as numerous other awards.


Éabha and Jack are coming to the end of their six-month residency in Birr as part of OFFline Film Festival. During their time here, they have developed an idea for their third short film called BUOY. The film is inspired by their personal experiences with sea swimming during the lockdowns in 2020. The film explores how sea swimming can shape a person's life and guide them through difficult moments.

In addition to developing this idea, the pair have also been working on a new film inspired by the surrounding boglands. This film is due to start production in late 2021 with support from Screen Ireland and RTÉ.


